VISION: Norfolk County Agricultural Society will offer the premiere entertainment facility in Norfolk County hosting and producing year-round agricultural programs and special events.

WHO CAN ENTER?

- Anyone can enter the fair competitions, no matter where you live, as long as you meet the requirements for each competition.
- You must enter your own original work unless specifically stated otherwise in a class.
- You can only enter items that have not been entered in previous years.
- Your entry must fit into a division and class listed in the prize book.

HOW OLD DO I HAVE TO BE TO ENTER?

- The Junior Fair is open to anyone under 18 years of age as of October 6, 2026, or a full-time high school student.
- Some competitions have different age limits.
- You can enter an older age group, but not younger ones. You may be asked to show proof of age.

HOW DO I ENTER?

- For easy online registration of ALL exhibits, please visit norfolkcountyfair.com and click **COMPETITIONS**.

IS THERE A FEE TO ENTER?

- No fee for your original junior entry form.
- If you need to add or change entries later, a \$5.00 fee per change will apply.

ENTRY FORM DEADLINE:

- **The deadline to submit entries is Saturday September 26, 2026 at midnight.**
- **High School entry deadline is Friday, September 25, 2026.**
- **ONLY ENTER YOUR SCHOOL IF YOU ARE ENTERING WITH YOUR SCHOOL.**
- For all entries that have a school name attached to it; the tags will go to the school.
- The Fair Office is open Monday – Thursday from 9:00 am – 5:00 pm and Friday 9:00 am – 4:00 pm throughout September. Please check our website for summer hours.

WHAT HAPPENS AFTER I SUBMIT MY ENTRIES?

- You will receive a confirmation email to confirm your entry.
- We print your entry tags.
- You will need to pick up your tags at the NCAS Office before the Fair and affix them securely to your entry in order to submit your items.
- You will be contacted by email when tags are ready for pick up.

WHEN WILL ENTRIES BE JUDGED?

All competitions will be judged on **Monday, October 5, 2026.**

No spectators are allowed during judging.

WHEN DO I PICK UP MY ENTRIES?

ALL entries must stay in place until the end of fair.

Entries must be picked up:

- Tuesday, October 14, 2025 between 10:00 am – 1:00 pm **or** 5:00 pm – 7:00 pm at the same building where you dropped them off.
- Wednesday October 15, 2026 between 3 pm - 5 pm in the Homecraft Building Basement (Junior Fair)

Items not picked up by 5 pm Wednesday October 15, 2026 will be recycled.

IF I WIN PRIZE MONEY, HOW DO I GET IT?

Junior entrants can pick up their prizes at the Fair Office, during the fair between **10:00 am - 5:00 pm** on:

- **Saturday, October 10**
- **Sunday, October 11**
- **Monday, October 12**
- **Tuesday, October 13, 2026.** 10:00 am - 1:00 pm **or** 5:00 pm-7:00 pm
- **Wednesday, October 14, 2026**

If you entered under your school name your prize money will be delivered to your school.

Prize money must be picked up by **October 30, 2026**, or will be considered forfeited.

- Ribbons are awarded to 1st - 6th place winners.

HONOURING EXCELLENCE AT THE COUNTY FAIR

The accumulation of points for the following three Junior Fair Awards includes all divisions in this list with the exception of Division J5080 Kiddie Korner, Division 549 Poultry and any 4-H Divisions.

JUNIOR FAIR YOUTH GRAND CHAMPION & RESERVE GRAND CHAMPION EXHIBITOR

The Youth winning the highest number of points in the Junior Department will receive \$100 for Grand Champion and \$75 for Reserve Grand Champion as well as a rosette, This score is based on a point system as follows:

1st - 10 points; 2nd - 7 points; 3rd - 5 points; 4th - 3 points; 5th to 10th - 1 point.

This award is not to be won two years in succession by the same exhibitor. This award may not be awarded to any one exhibitor more than two times.

HEMECRAFT AWARD

This is awarded to the secondary school with the most points,

1st - 10 points; 2nd - 7 points; 3rd - 5 points; 4th - 3 points; 5th to 10th - 1 point.
